



## What is the Emergency Housing Voucher program?

The Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) program is a federal rental assistance program serving low-income households across the country. EHV helps individuals and families locate rental housing and provides financial assistance to make their rent affordable. Assisted households pay approximately 30% of their income towards rent. The Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino (HACSB) administers the EHV program in San Bernardino County.

## Who is eligible?

Households must meet at least one of the following categories:

1. Homeless
2. At risk of being homeless
3. Fleeing or attempting to flee:
  - a. Domestic violence;
  - b. Dating violence;
  - c. Sexual assault;
  - d. Stalking; and/or
  - e. Human trafficking
4. Recently homeless, and rental assistance will prevent a return to homelessness or high risk of housing instability.

The household must also be low-income. The household's total income cannot be more than the amounts listed in the table below.

Household Size	Maximum Income
1 Person	\$49,300
2 Persons	\$56,350
3 persons	\$63,400

Household Size	Maximum Income
4 Persons	\$70,400
5 Persons	\$76,050
6 Persons	\$81,700

All adult household members will be subject to a criminal history background check.

## How do I apply?

HACSB cannot accept applications directly from the public for this program. Individuals and families must be referred to HACSB through the San Bernardino County Coordinated Entry System (CES) or a victim service provider (VSP) contracting with HACSB.

Only referrals from partner organizations can be processed for the EHV program. Contact United Way 2-1-1, a homeless services organization, or a victim service provider for more information.
